

How to Apply

Submit a pre-application form which is available from the Trust's web-site or contact the Trust. This will allow us to establish whether proposed works are considered eligible. A minimum of three quotations are needed along with a completed grant application form and supporting information; including evidence of ownership and responsibility for repairs.

Grant offers are made by letter and contain conditions of award that must be accepted. Work that is started before an offer of a grant is made and accepted in writing will not be eligible. Planning Permission, Listed Building Consent and other permissions might be required. These must be in place prior to eligible work starting. Payment of a grant is made on completion of work in compliance with grant conditions.

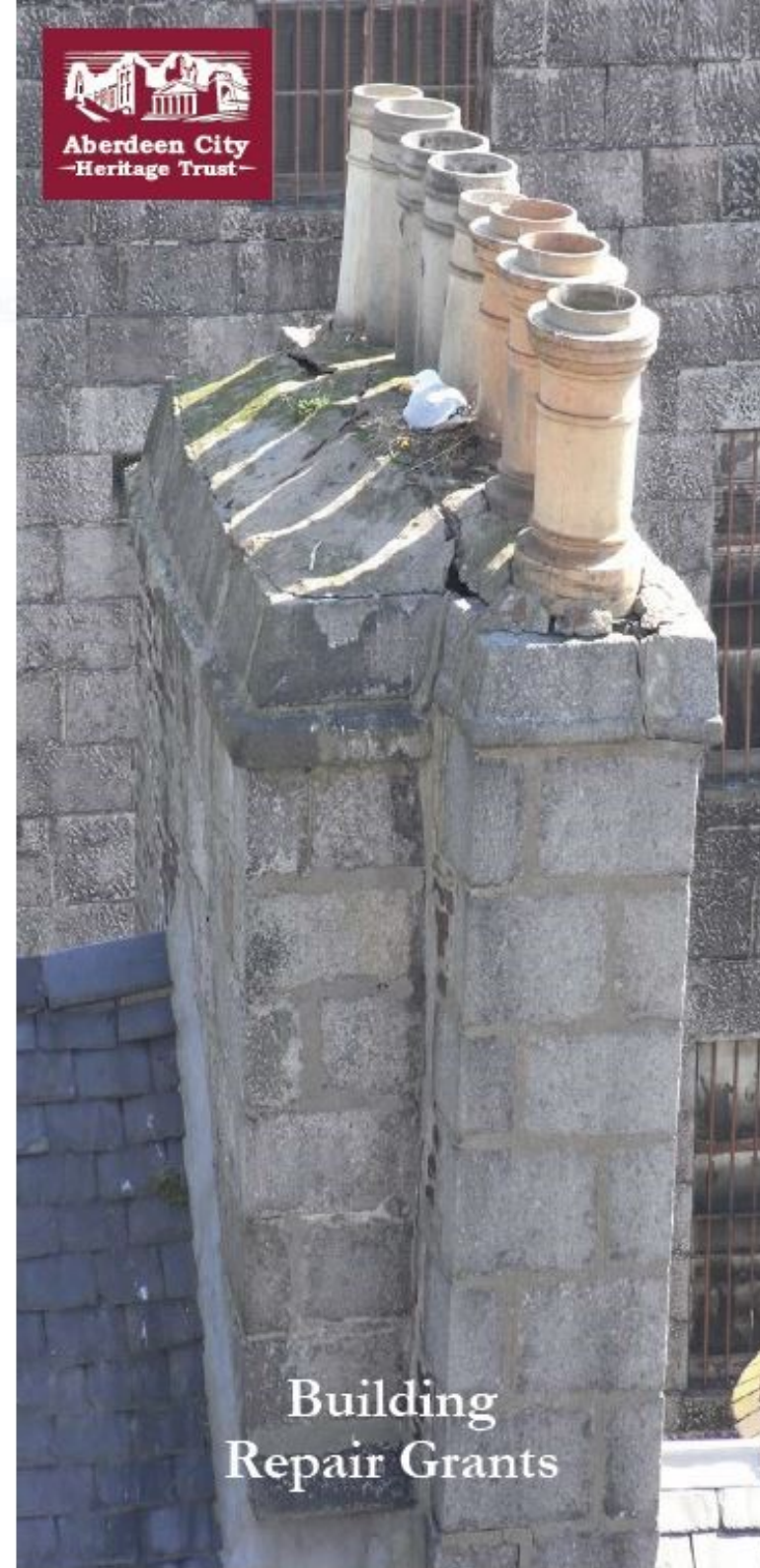

Repair Grants

Eligible work



The following are examples of types of work that may attract grant assistance where carried out using traditional materials and techniques subject to agreement:

- structural repair
- reroofing
- repair of chimneys (not removal)
- repair or replacement of gutters
- traditional leadwork
- masonry repair
- repair or reinstatement of sash and case windows
- repair or reinstatement of traditional external doors
- reinstatement of shopfronts to an agreed pattern
- decoration where associated with eligible repair work

Non-eligible work



The following are examples of types of work that are not eligible:

- running costs or maintenance such as clearing gutters, localised repointing or fixing slipped slates
- repair of modern windows, doors and shopfronts
- redecoration schemes
- alteration of properties (other than to reinstate them)
- interior repair or alteration including specialist damp proofing or timber treatments
- use of materials or techniques that do not conform to current best conservation practice

Aberdeen City Heritage Trust

Aberdeen City Heritage Trust is a limited company and Scottish charity established to promote and care for Aberdeen's historic built environment. The Trust's purpose is to understand, conserve and celebrate Aberdeen's historic built environment.

Properties that may be eligible for assistance

The Trust's focus for building repair grants for the period to March 2021 is supporting projects that help sustain or stimulate business activity or contribute towards improving the appearance of the environment within defined streets in Aberdeen City Centre. (see Map)

Building repair grants may, be made available for buildings that appear on the Buildings at Risk Register for Scotland and are Listed. Priorities may be subject to change.
